Fall Yard Waste Curbside Tips

Bin its Use a reusable metal or rigid plastic container with handles and marked with a large "X" on all sides

Bag it: Use biodegradable paper yard waste bags

Bundle it: Bundle branches securely with twine

Each container, bag, or bundle must weigh 40 pounds or less

County issued recycling carts, plastic bags, and non-rigid, lightweight containers, including fabric, plastic, collapsible mesh, or other reusable bags are NOT an acceptable container for yard waste collection. For questions, please call 410-222-7951.


